


## DAYTON CITIZENS RAISE MEMORIAL IN HONOR OF PIONEER CITIZEN.



*Dayton Fountain.*

The city of Dayton, Yamhill County, was the scene of a pretty and enjoyable ceremony on the occasion of the dedication of the new City Park fountain, known as Martin Miller fountain.

The fountain was erected and dedicated to the memory of Martin Miller, pioneer citizen of Dayton, who granted that city a perpetual right to the use of an abundant supply of pure water originating on his farm some distance away. As a result Dayton enjoys an excellent system of gravity water supply. To the efforts of members of the auxiliary of the Dayton Commercial Club and the Pleasant Hour Reading Club, of that city, is due the erection of the fountain. The fountain, which was designed by E. Kroner, architect, of Portland, without charge to the city, was christened in the presence of the entire population of Dayton and of the surrounding country. Songs and addresses and exercises, participated in by the school children, featured the affair. R. L. Harris, ex-Mayor, delivered the principal address, dedicating the fountain to the use of all who might pass that way.

The committee of women in charge of the event comprised Mesdames L. H. Litscher, J. L. Sherman, M. Miller and E. Nichols.
